[1869 Denton] Buttermere part of Lorton chapelry
 [1829 P&W]- Chapel of ease is a small ancient building. The dead are buried at Lorton chapel which is dedicated to St Cuthbert and is a perpetual curacy
 [1847 M&W]- The Chapel of ease was rebuilt in 1841 Blue slate quarries called Honister Cragg
 [OS 1st ed. 1863]- Church (per curacy)
 [OS 2nd ed. 1898]- Church
 [1901 Bulmer]- St James Church erected in 1840 upon the site of an older one

[1829 P&W]- School
 [OS 2nd ed. 1898]- School
 [1901 Bulmer] A school erected approximately in 1866 was built to accommodate 25 pupils. Average attendance of 14 in 1901.
