ALL	5	1671	34	` This county, according to its Ecclesiasticall Government is divided into the Diocesses of <i>Chester</i> and <i>Carliel</i> ; ye south part thereof is called <i>Copeland</i> , viz. Between ye Rivers <i>Dudden</i> and <i>Darwent</i> is within ye Arch Deaconry of <i>Richmond</i> and in <i>Chester</i> diocess,` ` Its also divided into severall Deaneryes wch are again divided into many Parishes.`		
ALL	6	1671	34	` The division thereof according to its Temporall Government is into Wards (there being no Hundreds in this county, being freed from all subsidyes untill King James his time, by reason of its great charge in border service) called <i>Allerdale-ward</i> above <i>Derwent</i> ` ` wch Wards are again divided into many <i>Constablewicks</i> .`		
WHT	2	1307-1671	44	Wythop, a manor well wooded wch from ye <i>Lucys</i> came to ye <i>Lowthers</i> of <i>Lowther</i> in <i>Westmorland</i> in E.2. time, in wch family it continued untill Sr <i>Richard Lowther Kt</i> conveyed it in the beginning of King <i>James</i> his reigne unto Sr <i>Richard Fletcher Kt</i> , from whom it descended unto Sir <i>Henry Fletcher Baronet</i> and from him to Sr <i>George Fletcher</i> of <i>Hutton Baronet</i> , ye present Lord of this manor. King <i>Edward</i> granted his License under ye great seal to <i>Hugh Lowther</i> for ye embatteling of his mansion house of <i>Withop</i> wch is now ruinated. Within this manor ther` s a Park anciently stored with <i>Deer</i> and ye fishing of <i>Bastenthwait Water</i> so farr this manor doth extende itself doth belong to ye Lord of this manor for ye use of his owne table.
