DEA	4	1818	119	Dean Parish, S Shewen, curate. PARTICULARS relating to Endowments for education of Youth; 'A grammar school, containing 40 children, the master of whom receives 10 l. per ann. Bequeathed by a Mr Fox in the reign of queen Elizabeth being originally a money payment, together with a small quarterage, making his salary between 40 l. and 50 l. per ann'. OTHER INSTITUTIONS; 'A Sunday school, in which some 60 to 70 children are instructed'. OBSERVATIONS; the poor would very gladly accept the means of instruction, if offered to them'.			
LOW	4	1818	122	L. Dodson, curate. Jon ⁿ Stanton, ass ^t curate. PARTICULARS relating to Endowments for education of Youth; 'One school, in which upon average 15 children are taught, possessing 11 l. per ann. Arising from interest of money, which the master receives with quarter pence'. OTHER INSTITUTIONS; 'One school partly supported by subscription, and partly by quarter pence, in which about 45 children are instructed.' OBSERVATIONS; The poor are desirous of more adequate means of instruction'.			
LOR, BRA, WHT	4	1818	122	Lorton parochial chapelry [note excluding Buttermere]. Lorton not signed, Wythop, W Sewell, curate. PARTICULARS relating to Endowments for education of Youth; 'One school endowed with 4 l. 10 s. per ann. In which about 70 children are instructed, one half of whom being the children of poor people, are very imperfectly taught'. OTHER INSTITUTIONS; 'none' [but we know the Lorton Sunday School existed]. OBSERVATIONS; the poorer classes are very desirous of instruction, but are without sufficient means. There is a school at Embleton, in Brigham Parish, to which the poor of Wythop have access'.

PARTICULARS relating to Endowments for education of Youth; 'A parish school, at Embleton, containing 30 children, aided annually by the interest arising from 8 l. in the chapelry'. OTHER INSTITUTIONS; A school at Embleton, open to this chapelry and that of Wythop in Lorton parish, containing from 22 to 38 children'.		In entry for Brigham Parish, which includes Cockermouth.	
MOS	4	1818	116	PARTICULARS relating to Endowments for education of Youth; 'In Mosser there is a small school endowed with 3 l. per ann. In which 30 children are taught'. OBSERVATIONS; 'In the townships of Buttermere, Cockermouth and Mosser, most of the labouring classes are very poor, and have not the means, yet are very desirous of having their children educated'.		In entry for Brigham Parish, which includes Cockermouth.	
SET	4	1818	116	PARTICULARS relating to Endowments for education of Youth; 'The school at Setmurthy had an allotment of 40 acres when the common was inclosed by act of Parliament, being considered as a full compensation to the master for teaching all the poor children of Setmurthy, who are seldom more than 20'. OBSERVATIONS; 'In the townships of Buttermere, Cockermouth and Mosser, most of the labouring classes are very poor, and have not the means, yet are very desirous of having their children educated'.
